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Band Membership Requirements

To be a member of the Prescott band program, students must be enrolled in the band class for the entire year and participate in **all classes, after-school rehearsals, and events**. Students must also adhere to the rules and policies stated in the handbook.

Attendance

The success of the Prescott band relies on everyone's participation and hard work. Because of this, there are some attendance policies that must be followed.

Policies

- **Attendance at all concerts and after school rehearsals is required.**
- There are no unexcused absences at performances.
- All excuses, other than emergencies, must be submitted in writing to the director as soon as possible.
- Performances are scheduled months in advance. The yearly calendar can be viewed at PrescottBand.com. Transportation/scheduling issues (work schedules, doctor's appointments, etc...) should be dealt with promptly. Notify the director as soon as issues arise. Any scheduling changes will be communicated as soon as possible.

Excused Absences

Absences at performances are unacceptable and are only excused for emergencies and other extreme circumstances. All excuses are subject to review by the director and may be rejected if deemed unsuitable. Excused absences include sickness, family emergency, other school sponsored events (with approval), etc... *All non-emergency excuses must be submitted in writing to the director prior to the event and must be approved.* In the event of an absence from a performance a student may be asked to perform their concert music individually for a grade (live or recorded) or given an appropriate written assignment.

Band Rules

1. Follow all school rules
2. Be respectful
3. **No cell phones in the band room without permission**
4. Only play your instrument
5. No gum, food, or drinks

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Consequences

Behavior and discipline procedures will follow the same guidelines as Prescott South Middle School.

Rehearsal Guidelines

1. Be on time – Always arrive early. You need time to get your instrument, assemble it, warm-up, and have a seat.
2. **Always have a pencil** – to mark your music and for assignments
3. Be prepared – have music prepared and have materials daily
4. Never give up – don't get frustrated! Music takes persistence! Music is worth the hard work!

Description of Ensembles

6th grade band – This is the PSMS beginning band. We learn the fundamentals of performing our instruments: from assembly to making our first sound!

7th grade band – In this group we continue to develop basic skills, technique, and musicianship but also start to learn more advanced musical concepts and theory. Students in this group have the opportunity to audition from honor groups and to perform in extra curricular ensembles.

8th grade band – This group is for students who have developed the necessary techniques needed to perform more advanced literature. In this class, students continue their growth of basic musicianship and technique but also start to work on skills needed at the high school level.

Pep Band – The pep band is an ensemble that performs for events such as football games, pep rallies, parades, and more. The purpose of this group is to represent PSMS actively in the community and to support our athletic department. This group will perform at all home football games and will march in the Christmas Parade (tentatively). This group is made up of students in 7th and 8th grade.

***Jazz Band** – The Jazz Band is an extracurricular ensemble that will primarily meet after school. This group focuses on developing the skills necessary to play big band and small ensemble styles of jazz. The size of the Jazz Band is limited and requires an audition to join.

***Chamber Ensembles** – Chamber Ensembles are small groups of students that perform chamber music (duets, trios, quartets, etc...). These groups give students the opportunity to perform in a small setting which helps students develop individual skills.

***Percussion Ensemble** – Percussion Ensemble is a percussion only group that focuses on percussion technique and chamber music.

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***Honor Band** – Honor band is an extracurricular group that meets after school. Membership is by audition/invitation. This group’s goal is to perform high quality concert band music. This group will perform at concerts and possibly Concert Performance Assessment

* These ensembles are extracurricular and are dependent on student interest, time, and playing ability.

Materials

Each band student is expected to have the following materials:

6th Grade Band

- Instrument
- Instrument Accessories (Dependent on instrument)
- Uniform (See below)
- Essential Elements Book 1 (for your instrument)
- Pencil
- Folder (to organize and keep up with music and assignments)
- 5 Plastic page protectors
- Metronome/tuner (recommended, but not required-search for Tonal Energy Tuner on the app store)

7th Grade Band

- All 6th grade materials **and**
- Essential Elements Book 2 (for your instrument)
- Flip Folder (with 10 pages) *and* Lyre (specific to your instrument!) *optional*
- See additional uniform requirements*

8th Grade Band

- All 6th and 7th grade materials
- See additional uniform requirements*

Uniform

The PSMS Band not only strives to sound great, but to look great, too. Because of this goal we request students to wear a uniform during performances and other special events. This uniform consists of:

- Band Polo Shirt (purchased through the school for \$20.00, see attached order form)
- Black Pants
- Black Belt
- Black Dress Shoes
- Black Socks

Absolutely no jeans of any sort

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Midstate Band

The regional band organization (MTSBOA) has a yearly honor band called the Midstate Band. This ensemble is audition only and is composed of the best musicians from Middle Tennessee. This ensemble plays high quality band music and is an amazing experience for young musicians. The PSMS Band STRONGLY encourages participation in this event and hopes to have a strong turnout this year.

Private Lessons

Individual instruction is the key to success in music performance. At PSMS we STRONGLY encourage students to take private lessons. We bring in professional players and teachers from around Middle Tennessee to give quality private lessons. These lessons mostly take place after school and have a small additional cost. It is an investment that pays off. Students enrolled in private lessons are better prepared to make honor bands such as Midstate and are more successful on their instrument. More information regarding lessons will be sent home at the beginning of the school year.

Solo and Ensemble

All students are expected to learn solo or ensemble music throughout the course of the 2nd semester. It is our expectation that 7th and 8th grade students will perform their selections at the MTSBOA Solo and Ensemble Assessment held at Cookeville High School. Dates, times, and registration regarding this event will be sent home later in the school year.

Grading

50% Daily Grades (objectives, in-class activities, etc...)
50% Performances and Assessments

Band is a hands-on learning activity. Daily classroom work and rehearsals are the vehicles through which learning takes place. It is for this reason that the PSMS Band is absolutely insistent upon each student's daily participation. Satisfactory classroom participation, playing and written assignments, and preparedness (having all materials-reeds, music, instrument, pencil, books, accessories, etc...) make up 50% of a student's grade. Students will receive a daily grade that reflects participation, preparedness (having materials and having music prepared, *aka practice*), and behavior. Students will also have occasional written and performance based assignments.

Band is unique in that it is assessed in multiple ways. 50% of a student's grade comes from traditional written assessments and musical performances (performance assessments). Musical performances cannot be duplicated and are considered major assessments. **Attendance at ALL performances is mandatory.** Only in extreme circumstances will students be allowed to make up performance grades. This will be done through appropriate assignments such as performing/recording concert music individually or completing a written assignment.

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Grading Continued

Lastly, success on an instrument is directly related to practice at home. To encourage consistent practice and for students to get feedback on their individual performance, students will be expected to perform a variety of exercises or skills known as objectives. Students must perform the exercises without error, in person or remotely (more info to come) for the director to receive credit. Each student is expected to perform a minimum number of objectives per grading period. Details about objectives will be passed out at the beginning of the school year.
